

An "inactive" Social Butterflies member means that a member has not been in contact with Queen Mum Debb or participated in any Social Butterflies activity or event in a year or more; they will then be put on "in-active" member's list. They are then taken off the Social Butterflies Roster and will not receive any further email blasts about Social Butterflies events/activites. The member will then no longer be able to participate in "Social Butterflies" only events/activities.

In January each year, at Social Butterflies "Planning Meeting," the group discusses membership. If a member has not participated in any Social Butterflies activity or event; or communicated with Queen Mum Debb or Vice Queen Pam over the last year; that member may be considered for "inactive" status. The member will then be sent an email, explaining their lack of participation and/or interest in Social Butterflies and told they will be put in an "inactive" status, unless they make contact with Queen Mum Debb or Vice Queen Pam requesting their interest to stay an "active" Social Butterflies member.

First an email is sent to the member. Second it is followed up with a "snail" mail letter advising the member of *Social Butterflies* concerns and for the member to contact Queen Mum Debb. It also states if that member wishes to become an "active" *Social Butterflies* member again at any time after, all the member needs to do is contact Queen Mum Debb requesting that their membership be changed back to an "active" member status.

If there is no contact from the absent member after three weeks, as stated in the email and snail mail, their membership will be changed to "inactive" status.

This action is to keep our membership current with, active, and supportive members. By removing uninterested or non-supportive, members we make room for new members. If the member changes their mind or has more time in the future to participate in *Social Butterflies* fun, they can contact Queen Mum Debb and ask to be changed back to an "active" status.

We understand that factors like life changes, health issues, and interest, may keep members from participating. Just as with any other group/club communication is always a must and encouraged to keep your membership active.
